Aftercare Guidelines and Explanation of Routine

For any new students attending aftercare, and even ones that have been here before, below is an explanation of our schedule and expectations for anyone who attends:

- Students arrive in the cafeteria and check-in with staff.
- Students can pick a snack that is provided by school - Doritos, pretzels, chips, goldfish
- Students then begin any homework and studying that they have. We refer to this as “Quiet Time”
- We will then head outside for play - sports balls and sidewalk chalk are provided. In the winter months, we go outside first, then complete homework. The gym is utilized during inclement weather.
- Students then come back inside for free play. We have Legos, coloring books, various building toys, dolls, play food, Mr. Potato Head, board games, action figures, drawing paper, etc.

Students are expected to:

- Follow the same guidelines that are in the student handbook
- Keep hands to themselves
- No bullying, teasing, or name-calling during sports or free play
 - (Children are not forced to participate in activities if they don't want to)
- Complete homework assignments when asked.
 - (If parents prefer for students to complete it at home, staff should be notified).
- Play appropriately with other students
- Be respectful of any and all aftercare sports equipment, homework supplies, and free-play items.
- If any student would like to bring a book or toy from home, they are permitted to do so at their own risk. Please be mindful of other students who may touch your items.
- Students are asked to abide by the school's chromebook policy and are not permitted to go on any websites that are not approved by teachers.

Cell phones: Should be left in backpacks. If a student needs to contact a parent, they should ask permission first.
